Research on Economic Inequality, Volume 27

Volume editors: Koen Decancq and Philippe Van Kerm

The editors of Research on Economic Inequality invite submissions to Volume 27 of the series. For this 2019 volume, we have a special interest in the question “Why inequality differs so much across countries?” While income inequality trends have been extensively researched, much less is known about the driving forces behind international differences in inequality.

Against this background, we seek to attract papers discussing the role of labour markets, taxation, social protection and redistributive policies, but we are also interested in papers studying the role of deeper drivers such as political institutions, norms and attitudes and preferences for redistribution. Advancements to methodology and discussion of the cross-country comparability of inequality measures are also welcome. While the main discussion may be about income inequality, we hope to attract contributions about wealth, consumption or other forms of inequalities.

The timetable for Volume 27 is as follows:

Submission deadline: **November 15, 2018**

Initial Screening: December 1, 2018

Reviews Completed: March 1, 2019

Final Manuscripts Due: **April 1, 2019**

Publication: Summer 2019

We expect papers of about 6500 words in length – shortening of significantly longer pieces may be requested during the review process.
